Topics & Discussion

#### **Mission Statement**

GFine delegated the creation of a Mission Statement (MS) to members present for next meeting GMartin wanted a MS to include a "well thought out 'Bag Ban Law" that includes RAdams suggests a MS would include input from business community

GFine "not sure what the mission of our committee would be" contingent upon Article passage, or not

GFine asks whether we are going to be subject matter experts, whether we would provide Board of Health subcommittee's findings

GMartin wants to formulate a first draft during the next meeting

RAdams notes Open Meeting Law and requirement for zero deliberation between members prior to next meeting

GFine discusses Open Meeting Law requirements

GFine requests that each member forward their full contact information to him via email

### **Election of Chair & Clerk**

GMartin volunteered to be Clerk

GFine motioned to elect GMartin Chair

RAdams seconded motion

All voted in favour of motion

GFine motioned to elect RAdams Clerk

GMartin seconded motion

All voted in favour of motion

GFine offered to tutorial each in their respective capacities

GMartin discussed September surgery and possible elongated absence

RAdams noted phone-in presence to meetings possible

#### Citizen Petition (CP) Discussion

GFine noted that of the last nine CP's all nine passed

Perhaps should the CP pass the subcommittee may be dissolved

GFine noted Sabrina Chilcott facilitated redaction of CP

Otherwise a replication of Marshfield's ByLaw banning Plastic Bags

GMartin noted that the CP was unlikely to be well suited to Pembroke, but that it might be

GMartin stated that he is personally for a plastic bag ban in Pembroke

GFine stated that he is unlikely to be a supporter

RAdams would like to examine the CP and see if an amendment(s) might make it palatable to voters

GMartin thinks there is a high-risk this ill-suited CP not pass at Town Meeting

"Is this bylaw better than no by-law? I don't know."

GFine noted that any plastic bag ban would affect the "each and every citizen" of Pembroke "I have some great reservations. I will not be voting for it."

GFine disagrees with the position of seeking to amend the CP

GMartin stated he is not prepared whether to say this CP is better than no by-law, or not "Our opinion is crucial on this CP."

GMartin discusses his experiences in Wellesley's passage of a Plastic Bag Ban bylaw

GMartins has strong reservations about seeking to amend CP

May confuse voters too much, and cause CP's defeat

GFine & RAdams assess support of Selectmen

GFine counts 4 in support 1 in opposition

RAdams counts 3 in support and 2 in opposition

#### **GMartin Raises Reservations Being Chair**

GMartin unsure as to his ability post-op whether he will be to function adequately as chair GMartin motions that RAdams be chair

RAdams notes that GMartin should remain chair

Given his past experiences

Notes that Clerk becomes chair in their absence

GFine notes that GMartin has the necessary gravitas to best represent subcommittee's effort

RAdams questions GMartins' nature of reservation

GFine notes that the experience is good for GMartin

There is no written rule as to who becomes chair

#### **Return to Discussion of CP**

GMartin asks each member whether they support/non-support of CP

RAdams supports the CP, but with amendments

GFine does not support the CP

GMartin is unsure whether he supports the CP

Wants to further evaluate

#### **Next Meeting Date Discussion**

Each member raises days of week that not workable

GMartin wants to pick only the next meeting date at the conclusion of the meeting, not recurring

GMartin stated next meeting is Tuesday 11 September 2018 @ 730pm
GFine notes that Meeting Date & Agenda needs publication 48 hours prior due to Open Meeting Law
