REMINDER: INVASIVE PLANT ALERT

HOBOMOCK POND IS BEING TREATED FOR THE NON-NATIVE AND HIGHLY INVASIVE PLANT HYDRILLA.



Hydrilla (*Hydrilla verticillata*) is native to Europe and Asia and was likely introduced into the United States through the aquarium industry. The plant can be spread by transporting small vegetative fragments to other ponds and lakes. Because of Hydrilla's ability to spread and aggressively colonize aquatic habitats, its growth poses a significant threat to the native aquatic vegetation communities of Hobomock Pond as well as other area waterbodies.

IN AN EFFORT TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THIS INVASIVE SPECIES TO OTHER AREA PONDS, HOBOMOCK POND WILL BE **CLOSED** TO ALL BOATING.

THIS CLOSURE IS PER THE ORDER OF THE PEMBROKE CONSERVATION COMMISSION AND WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.
